A. Personal Statement

I am a behavioral scientist with a background in psychology, social work, and public health. My growing research program addresses the psychological, social, cultural, and developmental needs of vulnerable young adult populations. Supported by the NIDA T32 predoctoral fellowship, my dissertation identifies psychological and community-level protective factors related to risk behaviors among at-risk young adults. In my postdoctoral training, I focus on the unique developmental, psychosocial, and medical needs of adolescents and young adults (AYAs) with cancer. More specifically, my research focuses on leveraging digital health interventions to improve psychosocial outcomes among AYA cancer survivors: (1) Developing scalable digital health interventions and (2) Examining the best strategies to implement them in community and healthcare settings. My initial work demonstrated the feasibility of a commercially available mindfulness-based mobile application in improving mindfulness, cognitive reappraisal, perceived stress, mental health, and sleep among AYA cancer survivors. I also explore the provider- and system-level factors related to sustainable implementation and engagement of digital health interventions in AYA survivorship care. These experiences have prepared me to lead research at the intersection of psycho-oncology and digital health space among a vulnerable population in AYAs with cancer.

C. Contribution to Science

- 1. Digital Health Interventions for Adolescent and Young Adult Cancer Survivors: As a postdoctoral fellow, my research focuses on identifying innovative ways to help adolescent and young adult cancer patients and survivors navigate their unique needs in cancer survivorship. Most recently, I have focused on leveraging technology to deliver psychosocial interventions suitable for this population (e.g., mindfulness-based mobile application and novel peer mentor self-management interventions). Our results have demonstrated positive effects on stress and emotions, health-related quality of life (e.g., physical and mental health, sleep), and mindfulness and stress appraisal. Further development and testing of these interventions is needed. In addition, both quantitative and qualitative results suggest that human support (e.g., peers) can enhance mobile app engagement, which gives rationale to the proposed Peer Digital Coach intervention study.

- 2. An integrative and holistic approach to cancer care: My predoctoral contributions were focused on applying my background in psychology to understanding and improving patient-reported outcomes in cancer care. More specifically, I worked with a team of physicians at Maimonides Cancer Center to understand the impact of psychosocial, spiritual, and religious needs on patients' satisfaction with their medical care. These scholarly works identified salient spiritual and psychosocial needs among different racial and ethnic patient populations. The results showed spiritual needs were a strong predictor of quality of care among diverse cancer patients. Collectively, these findings brought awareness to the importance of patient-centered factors beyond medical-related issues, which may lead to the development of interventions that address spiritual needs to reduce health disparities in cancer care.

- 3. Multilevel factors contributing to patient satisfaction with medical care: Factors contributing to patients' satisfaction with their medical care are multifaceted and multilevel. My graduate research contributions focused on implementing and evaluating programs that seek to improve clinical practice. Working with different stakeholders, I evaluated the impacts of a national geriatric training/education initiative on nursing practice and patient outcomes in three phases: 1) assessing the impact of the program on nurses' clinical practice; 2) exploring the institution's support of the program; and 3) evaluating the impact of the program on patient outcomes. The results of these studies had a positive impact on patient care by highlighting the associated provider-level factors and opening new directions of research that inform patient-centered care from a multilevel perspective.
